2013 marks 30 years since the formation of the Farm Tree Group in the Kiewa Catchment



On Wednesday 24th August 1983, a public meeting was held at Gundowring to formally ratify the formation of the Kiewa Catchment Farm Tree Group. The Group's aims were to:

"Promote the conservation of existing vegetation & to encourage the regeneration & replanting of vegetation in line with achieving the best use of agricultural land in the Kiewa River Catchments".

Funding success! Kiewa Catchment to receive \$60,615.00 "Victorian Landcare Grant"



In times of increasing funding cuts, we are very pleased that our 2012-2013 works application was successful. Funds will be used to support: Revegetation Projects (fencing subsidy & supply of plants), Community Planting & Field Days, publishing of newsletters, a Revegetation Techniques Trial and Plant Identification & Propagation workshops.

We have 15 expressions of interest for 2013 Revegetation works. Limited funds are still available, so if you would like to undertake works on your property, please contact Belinda to arrange a site visit ASAP. Projects need to be an average of *at least* ten metres wide from banks, or an average minimum of 20 metres wide for biodiversity plantings. We are also taking Expressions of Interest for 2014 works.

Bus trip to Wirraminna Environmental Education Centre – Saturday 10th November



This is a fantastic opportunity to visit an outstanding example of a community-based project. Wirraminna occupies four hectares of formerly unused ground between the school and recreation ground in Burrumbuttock. From its beginning in 1995, it has developed into an environmental education centre that provides opportunities for discovery and learning about the natural environment, the ecology of the local woodlands and the beauty of native plants for our gardens.

Kergunyah-Gundowring: In late September, crayfish specialists, Dr Susan Lawler & Geoff Edney, surveyed the Kergunyah Wetlands to look for signs of crayfish activity. They found evidence of three species, the dam yabby, *Cherax destructor*, the rarely-seen swamp yabby, *C. rotundus* and the burrowing crayfish, *Engaeus cymus* (pictured). The site was recognised as having a very high biodiversity value.

Members and supporters are invited to a "Flora and Fauna Identification Workshop" at the Kergunyah Wetlands on Sunday 21st October, 4.00pm – 7.00pm.

We will conclude with a BBQ tea. Meet at Kergunyah reserve. For catering purposes, please reply to Belinda by Friday 19th October.
