Kiewa Catchment Earthworm Project in the news – "Such great length for soil health"



Our earthworm project was recently featured in the Country Mail section of the Border Mail. This was a great opportunity to demonstrate that Landcare is involved in a broad range of activities, which include enhancing soil health through the trialling of the deep-burrowing earthworm, *Aporrectodea longa*.

Sampling of the earthworm sites will begin in late August/early September, which will provide us with some indication on how successful our trials have been. Dr Bernard Doube will assist with the sampling process. In the meantime, we are having to top up the sheep dung on the sites, as our worms appear to have a good appetite.



TWO FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR FIRE-AFFECTED PROPERTIES/AREAS

The **Recycling for Recovery** Project has been funded by the sale of steel/scrap metal from fire-affected properties in the Black Saturday fires. You may be eligible for some financial assistance associated with erosion control and revegetation. The **Blackberry Action Program** is targeted to areas affected by the 2009 Beechworth Complex fires. The program provides grants to landowners to carry out works to control blackberry and other woody weeds. Grants will be made available on condition that the landholder, in conjunction with the Mudgegonga and District Blackberry Action Group (MADBAG), develops and commits to a work plan agreement. Grants will be offered to the value of 50% of cost of control to a maximum of \$2,000.00. Priority 1 is for properties directly affected by fires, and Priority 2 will be for properties located within the Beechworth Fire Complex. There will also be Field Days and Information sessions. Rabbit Scan Project, Mapping rabbit populations & developing biocontrol methods



Rabbitscan is an Australia-wide 'citizen science' project, inviting anyone to spot, collect and report visual or other evidence of rabbits and their impacts. We encourage you to participate by reporting sightings of rabbits to provide essential nation-wide information on the rabbit problem

Researchers need livers from rabbits that have died from RHD virus

Scientists need liver from dead rabbits to further develop rabbit biocontrol.

Scientists are currently identifying overseas strains of Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV) formerly known as Calicivirus, which might be effective against the resistance rabbits have developed throughout Australia. This is part of the RHD-Boost project which aims to improve the biological control of rabbits.

The RHD-Boost project team needs virus from rabbits which have died from natural outbreaks of RHD in areas where the virus hasn't been recently released. A freshly dead, but otherwise healthy-looking rabbit may indicate that it may have died from RHD. Rabbits that die from myxomatosis are not required.


Meeting with Guest speaker: Wednesday 11th May. 7.30pm
