Outcomes of Planning Kiewa Catchment Planning Workshop – March 2011



The results from the workshop held at Kergunyah in March have been collated and are now available on the Kiewa Catchment website (Click on "Planning Day Results" folder). The workshop reviewed past activities of the Network, i.e. what has worked well and why. Participants identified which activities were worth continuing with, and how this could happen. We look forward to putting some of these plans into action. Much will depend on obtaining funding to support these activities.

Restoration of Fox and Wild Dog Bounty in Victoria



Foxes and wild dogs cause considerable distress and economic losses to agriculture, as well as posing a major threat to native wildlife. The Victorian Government has allocated \$4 million over the next four years to reinstate a fox and wild dog bounty.

Minister for Agriculture and Food Security Peter Walsh recently announced they would provide \$50 for each wild dog and \$10 for each fox. Department of Primary Industries regional offices will administer the program, which is due to commence in November. At this stage, it is not known which part of the fox/wild dog will need to be presented to collect the bounty. Details will be announced later in the year.

The mouse bucket trap: A simple, "non chemical" alternative



Before you reach for the poison, consider a cheaper and environmentally friendly alternative — "the Bucket trap". Take a bucket and place a long piece of wood against it. The wood must be long enough to reach from the ground to the top of the container. Place 1 tablespoon of peanut butter in the container. The mice will smell the food and once in the container, will not be able to escape (you need to ensure the container is quite deep). The next job is to dispose of your catch humanely. Reports from Corowa farmers' indicate daily catches of 20+ mice. Design variations include cylinders coated in peanut butter, which are suspended by wire across the top of the bucket. (pictured).
