2nd Generation Funding Update

Jos McAlister is finalising 2009/2010 revegetation projects in Baranduda, Kancoona, Sandy Creek and Upper Kiewa, and a number of projects have been approved under 2010/2011 funding in Upper Gundowring, Tawonga, Kergunyah and Yackandandah areas.

Expressions of interest are being sought from landholders wanting to reduce stream/gully erosion and/or increase biodiversity on their properties through revegetation. Landcare can provide some assistance towards the cost of fencing and the supply of plants, guards and stakes. Projects must meet criteria in relation to plantings widths (usually 20 metres) and species selections. Plant species lists for Wodonga, mid-Kiewa and Upper Kiewa can be accessed by entering either "mid Kiewa native plant list" (includes Yackandandah area) or "upper Kiewa native plant list" into an internet search engine. “Do it with Dung” Project Update



The main beetle species currently active is *Bubas bison*. This is a shiny black beetle, approximately 13-20mm in length. The male has two horns on the head and a protruding shoulder horn on the mid-section. The female is a similar colour, but does not have any horns. The beetles fly at dusk and dawn, and are expected to be active until early Spring. Look for soil casts around dung pads and holes under pads.



Monitoring in the Kiewa Valley has shown a patchy distribution of this species. Good numbers have been trapped and observed at Yackandandah, Kergunyah, Dederang, Leneva and Upper Gundowring. This species is not established at Tawonga, however we expect this species to become established from our 2009 releases.

Regent Honeyeaters released in Chiltern-Mt Pilot – Reprint from ABC News



A group of critically endangered Regent Honeyeater birds were released into the wild in North East Victoria as part of a national program to help the species. The Department of Sustainability and Environment says there are fewer than one thousand Regent Honeyeaters left in Australia, and only one hundred in Victoria. Recovery co-ordinator, Dean Ingwersen says that 44 birds were released into the Chiltern-Mt Pilot National Park in May. Twenty-five of these birds are wearing radio transmitters that will be used to track the birds. The birds were bred at Taronga Zoo in Sydney, and it is hoped they will breed with wild birds.

All landholders are asked to keep an eye out for Regent Honeyeaters over the coming months and especially look for and record colour leg (both left and right) band combinations. Please notify Glen Johnson as soon as any sightings are made - 02 6020 8667.

Minimising the risk of *Neospora canium*: controlling wild dogs and foxes

Neospora canium has recently been confirmed at a property in the Valley. *Neospora* is a microscopic parasite that is considered a major cause of cattle abortion. The dog (including foxes and wild dogs) has been recognised as a host of the parasite and becomes infected after eating infected foetal calf tissue or afterbirth. The dogs pass parasite eggs in their faeces for several weeks. It is assumed that cows ingest eggs from contaminated pastures. Cows can act as carriers and pass infections onto their calves. There is currently no treatments available, so prevention is vital. (Information source: NSW Agnote DAI-314)

DPI NSW suggests that where practicable, every effort should be made to:

- Prevent contamination of pastures by dog faeces.
- Prevent farm dogs from scavenging aborted fetuses and afterbirth by not letting them wander freely, especially during the calving season.
- Bury, burn or dispose of aborted fetuses, dead calves and afterbirth,
- Control wild dogs and foxes as much as possible
