*Large holes indicates activity by larger beetles such as: bison and spiniger. .

LOW = Less than 10 beetles per dung pad, averaged over 4 pads.

Beetle activity is determined by inspecting four pads, and counting the number of tunnels found beneath the pad.

HIGHLIGHTS & OBSERVATIONS:

- There has been a marked decrease in dung beetle activity during July, with no beetle specimens found in the dung.
- Monitoring at this time last year revealed no dung beetle activity across the valley.
- Of 32 dung pads examined,16 (50%) had dung beetle activity.
- Most pads with signs of dung beetle activity had 1 tunnel (81%), whilst 19% of pads with activity had two tunnels beneath the pad.
- Although there is a lull in activity this is still a significant improvement on this time last year.




CATCHMENT WIDE DUNG BEETLE APPLICATION

"Do it with Dung... from the Mountains to the Murray"

An opportunity has arisen to apply for funding (Caring for Country) for a catchment-wide dung beetle education, release, trial and monitoring project. The Project application has been submitted by Kiewa Catchment Landcare Group and would involve groups from across the North East catchment and the Corowa shire.

If successful, the Project would commence in December 2008 and run for approximately 12 months, and will have 6-7 species trial sites and 100 fortnightly monitoring sites.
